The Enhancing Strategic Information (ESI) project is a regional strategic information program implemented by the Institute for Health Measurement (IHM).

The ESI project's main focus is to develop sustainable information systems in Swaziland and Lesotho.

In Lesotho, IHM was mandated to deliver a systemic approach to providing high quality SI technical assistance to the Ministry of Health (MoH).

ESI recognizes the developments in SI such as attempts to integrate the Health Management Information System and the introduction of an Electronic Medical Record system, decentralization of data management and encouragement for more utilization at lower levels within the MOH.
